The evaluation is carried out by considering the factors Like Paper Originality, Citation, Editorial Quality, and Regularity & International Presence.

Cosmos performs the in-depth analysis method. The acceptance and rejection rates of journals can be a determining factor. Low acceptance rate, high rejection rate journals are considered the best and most prestigious journals, as the acceptance criteria is of high quality standard. Many journals and societies have web pages that give publication data and style requirements and often include acceptance/rejection rates. The paper copy of the journal occasionally includes this data and will always provide current contact information, whether a journal is indexed in the major indexing/abstracting service in the field is another criteria that can be used to assess the worth and quality of a journal.

With its multidisciplinary nature the journal “The Clarion” aims at scholars, policy makers, practitioners who seek an interactive forum for the cross fertilization of ideas and perspective about world affairs.
